

Report of the Zoom meetings held on June 2

Treasurer's report was accepted. 14 members have not paid their dues yet. Jerry dropped four of them who we don't expect will be continuing their memberships on June 30. Ruth will keep after the other 10. [We found out after the meeting that the drops did not go through. However, two have since paid their dues.]

Chris and Eva will work on expanding the Membership committee to three members.

We voted to continue the theft insurance, which we'll need if we're going to continue applying for grants.

We voted to do Shawn's Bike Rides for the Blind project in the spring.

Boscov's "Friends Helping Friends" is returning to the old way. We'll be getting discount passes to sell for \$5, all of which we keep.

Greg continues to work on the blueberry orchard with help from Eden's Rose Foundation. The sign will be up shortly and topsoil/landscape development are on-going. He will have a booth at the block party that will be held in the neighborhood on 7/21

Jerry proposed the adoption of fund-raiser that he learned about at the DG testimonial that the Chazy Lions do. We sell tickets for \$10. Each one has a unique 3-digit number. Using the NYS daily lottery results, we pay the winner \$100 for weekdays and \$250 for Sunday. We do this for one month (we decided on Jan '22), so all ticket holders get 31 chances to win. If we sell all 1000 tickets, we'll net about \$5800.

Ruth gave out 17 eyeglasses during the last LY.

Jerry has sent two applicants to LEI for surgery.

We voted to be a Tee Sponsor at NABA's golf tournament for \$200.


