### As we start a new Lions Year ...

You'll notice that there's a new graphic in the upper left corner. It's the pin of District Governor Priscilla Laurin from the Chazy Lions Club. The apple was selected because Chazy has a very large apple orchards."

Report of the June 14 meetings at the Red Front

Lion Barb Bentley spoke to us about diabetes. She will be chairing diabetes for MD20, not just 20W. Lion Davia is one of three Lions trained to be a diabetes coordinator in 20W. The primary tools we have for educating the public are a tri-fold brochure that includes a Prediabetes Risk Assessment Test and bookmarks that provide basic information.

Lions Greg & Jodi showed up with their entourage of Del Ray, who lives near the blueberry orchard and has been very helpful working there with neighborhood kids, and 6 asylees (mostly from Venezuela) that they have been helping with food and other basics. Jodi presented a two-part proposal: 1. To spend \$500 to provide basic needs to the asylees who weeded and performed other clean-up tasks at the orchard. (We cannot actually pay them because of the 180-day ban on their working, but we are allowed to provide financial assistance.) 2. To spend \$500 on sulfur to improve the pH of the soil, as recommended by a local agronomist. The discussion was tabled so we could get on with our installation.

PDG John McDonald conducted the induction ceremony for our 2023-34 officers and board.

Lion Jerry then presented King Lion Eva with a Robert J. Uplinger Distinguished Service Award.

In an email vote after the meeting, we approved being a tee-sponsor for \$250 at NABA's golf fundraiser.


