But this year they're offering us Pre-sell days: On any day between Oct 11 and Oct 17, during the hours of our choosing, they'll set up a table near the front door where we can not only sell tickets, but distribute Lions lit like our new club brochure, coloring books, diabetes info, etc. Friday, Saturday and Sunday are their busiest days of
