Report of the board meetings held on Wednesday, December 16, at the Route 7 Diner

Committee reports:

Blood drives: Our next drive is Dec 23 from noon-6pm at the Hilton Garden Inn on Hoosick St.

Programs: Lion Kathy absent; January speaker is Alyssa Herman, ophthalmology student who coordinated last year's screening project at City Mission in Albany.

Used glasses: Lion Tom absent; no report.

Voice-mail log: Lion Jerry – there were only 16 calls in the past month, 2/3 of which were from our area.

Eyeglass requests: Last month, Lion Maryanne discussed a request, received from NABA, for special prescription sunglasses for Chhitup Lama, a visually-impaired Nepali whose organization helps the blind and visually impaired in the Humla district of Nepal. We voted to donate \$100. ZC Carol will request help from the other clubs in our zone. NABA will be donating, although we don't know how much. Lion Mike mentioned that the Albany Chapter of the American Council for the Blind is donating \$750 to Chhitup's school. Dr Monica Casey-Gee from NABA reports that with our help and NABA's, she was able to get Chhitup the glasses he needs.

Lion Maryanne sent out two vouchers for children in Albany County.

Hearing requests: Lion Doug sent out three applications in the past several months, but none has been returned.

Thanks to the 9 Lions who signed up to work on the Coats for Kids campaign. Final count was 477 coats. Interestingly, Rainbow Cleaners in Troy collected 215 coats, while two of the cleaners in Albany had none.

Popcorn sales inside the Atrium at the Victorian Stroll on Dec. 6 went quite well. Thanks to the 14 Lions & family members who worked on this annual project, we grossed \$493, with a net profit of around \$400.

The District is trying to get clubs to collect food during January for donation to local food banks. We decided that area supermarkets (Price Chopper & Hannaford's, specifically) seem to have their own food drives, as do other orgs like USPS, and that anything we do would be pretty much a drop in the bucket compared to their efforts. We voted not to adopt this as a project.

We had asked NABA and the Hearing Conservation Society to share the \$180 cost of a table at the Albany Jewish Community Center Health Fair to be held next May 15. Both organizations agreed.

Last month, we authorized Lion Joann Beach to spend up to \$250 for Christmas gifts for a family from Vanderheyden. She reported by e-mail on the gifts she bought and delivered to four teenagers.

We collected about 20 toys at our holiday party, which were delivered to CEO for their Christmas "store." Lion Jerry reminded everyone that they're still looking for volunteers to help parents make their selections. Lion Jerry will send out an e-mail asking Lions to sign up.

The Seal Campaign has brought in \$1050 so far from 20 donors.

We voted to donate \$100 to the Lions Eye Institute in lieu of buying and reselling chocolate bunnies. Since it's a donation, it should be earmarked towards a Knight of the Blind.

We voted to transfer funds from the club's charitable account to the 501(c)(3) account for a donation to LCIF. Lion Jerry will check to see whether we have an MJF balance.

They've got everything in different room for different age groups, and the volunteer's job is to help the clients "shop" for their kids and ensure that they take the right number of gifts.


