

Report of the board meetings held on Wednesday, June 15, at the Route 7 Diner

Lion Maryanne was absent, but Jerry had her verbal proxy. We were still one shy of a quorum, but we proceeded anyway.

Lion Elena joined us as a guest. Since she's accepted the PR chairmanship, we felt it was important for her to know what's going on.

There are still 8 Lions who haven't paid their dues yet. Dr Ted Belhumeur's letter of resignation said he has retired and will be moving to his new condo in Pompano Beach, FL. 5 Lions have promised to pay, so we could be dropping as many as 3 from the rolls before the end of June.

KL Chris raised the question of changing our meeting places. After some discussion, we decided that both the Red Front and the Route 7 Diner have been more than satisfactory: They don't charge for the room and the food is reasonably priced and more than acceptable. The locations are as good as any, considering the spread of our membership.

Discussing committee chairs, we agreed that the most important ones to fill (now that we have a PR chair) are fund-raising, programs and volunteer coordinator. Lion Fran agreed to chair the fund-raising committee but needs 2 or 3 people to work with her; she has several ideas already that need refining. Lion Paul thought that Lion Kathy might agree to another year as programs chair, in spite of her earlier refusal. [See page 4 for detailed job descriptions]

Lion Elena had a few questions about PR, as well as some suggestions.

We decided that October would be a good time for another auction. KL Chris will ask Lion Diane whether she will head up this profitable and fun-filled project.

Committee reports:

Eyeglass requests: Lion Maryanne has issued two vouchers for the twins we had approved last month, and has two more applications out.

Hearing requests: Upon Lion Doug's emailed recommendation, we approved a hearing aid request from a 76-yr-old woman living on social security.

We received thank-you notes from VISIONS and from Sight Society for our recent contributions.

We voted to donate \$200 to NABA for a tee sign at their annual golf tournament.


Lions Centennial and a bit of history

As you well know, LCI is 100 years old in 2017. The International convention next year is in Chicago, Lions' home town, from June 30-July 4, 2017, and it should be a doozie. If you've never been to an international convention, or even if you have, give some serious thought to attending this one. I think it would be great if we could get a group together. (FYI: Albany to Chicago is about a 2-hour flight, a 13-hour car ride or a 16-


hour overnight train ride.)

To celebrate LCI's 50th anniversary, The Post Office issued a 5¢ "Search for Peace" commemorative stamp in 1967. I learned this because a friend of mine who collects old postcards just bought me the first-day cover shown here.

SEARCH FOR PEACE

The International Association of Lions Clubs had its beginnings in the early part of the century. Incorporated under this title on October 24th, 1916 in Indiana by Dr. William P. Woods, the club's growth began. In the early days this service club was a knife and fork club, meeting usually for the luncheon hour. The need to spread soon was evident and Melvin Jones, an insurance man, took over the promotion of the club, a labor which lasted until his death in 1961.

The national organization was founded on June 7th, 1917 in Chicago's Hotel LaSalle and the first Lions convention took place in Dallas, Texas from October 8th to 10th, 1917 with Dr. Woods being elected to the presidency by the 46 delegates from the 23 participating clubs. Shortly thereafter the name Lions was described by Attorney Halsted Ritter as spelling out, ". . . not only the King of Beasts . . . it stands not only for fraternity, good fellowship, strength of character and purpose, but its letters L-I-O-N-S herald . . . the true meaning of . . . Citizenship: Liberty, Intelligence, Our Nation's Safety"

The Dallas convention produced the Constitution, a Code of Ethics and Objects, the purple and gold colors and set the club on its way to service. Lions International today have over 15,000 clubs and more than 760,000 members in over one hundred thirty countries. Club activities are of a civic nature and include patriotism, education, community betterment, health, welfare, safety, sight conservation, boys and girls activities, aid to the blind, etc.

Born in the war year of 1917 and believing peace to be possible, Lions International sponsored a peace essay contest for youth throughout the free world on the occasion of its Golden Jubilee. Eight winners received prizes at the Chicago convention in July 1967. At the same session, the United States Post Office Department issued a five cent "Search for Peace" commemorative postage stamp, the first day of issue being July 5th, 1967.
