# The March 7 meetings were moved to March 14 because of the weather. Here's the report:

The general meeting was called to order at 6:00 PM by KL Carol Quantock. She introduced Lion John Sutton from the Galway Lions Club, who spoke to us about the work he and the Galway Club have been doing, focusing on diabetes. He talked about last November's Diabetes Walk, and mentioned Rosie's Walk, a walk for diabetes event that will be held this summer. He asked that we support the Walk by participating, donating, or attending (or all the above) the event. His talk was warmly received and KL Carol thanked him for attending.

KL Carol mentioned that the MD20 NYS & Bermuda Lions Convention will be held this year from May 4-6, 2018 in Rochester, and if anyone would like to be a delegate, please let her know before the deadline of April 21.

The Board Meeting was called to order at 7:18 pm by KL Carol. Lion Ruth reported that she has been continuing to post items on Facebook. Lions John Bianco and Fran McDoal reported that there are no fund-raising plans in the works at this time. Lion Elena is on vacation in Florida, so there was no report on publicity, although KL Carol mentioned that she would be interviewing for Channel 13's "13 Kids Who Care," featuring Alexandra Sipos, sometime during the week of March 19, and would let people know when the segment would be aired.

KL Carol announced that the nominating committee (consisting of KL Carol and IPP Chris) would be looking for anyone to step up to the plate to fill potential open positions on the Board and/or committee chairs for the 2018-2019 Lions year. Phone calls will be made to confirm nominees and members who express interest in being on the Board. [See Election Time on page 3.]

Lion Elena, via e-mail, mentioned that since we participated in last year's Troy Fest in June, were we interested in participating again? Unfortunately, the payment to reserve the site is due on March 15, which didn't give the Board time enough to discuss whether it was to the Club's advantage to participate. A motion was made that we not participate this year, seconded, and passed unanimously.

The Charitable Board Meeting was called to order at 7:30 pm by KL Carol. The decision of Luxottica, the parent company of LensCrafters, to terminate the eyeglass voucher program was discussed, as we are awaiting any kind of word from LCI/LCIF as to whether a replacement program would be made available. The same concern applies to the AHAP program, as we have not received communication about a replacement program. The Board felt that individual clubs should be informing applicants that these programs are on hold until further notice, even though DiNapoli Opticians offered to help. However, Board members felt that attempts to address applications for assistance without guidance from higher levels (District, National) would be potentially unfair to applicants, since selection criteria would differ from club to club. KL Carol reported that Tara from Freely Clothing e-mailed with a potential "ribbon-cutting" ceremony to be held in mid-April, since the weather has been so uncooperative. We will await further word from Tara and the City of Watervliet, but it was a matter of concern that we would be able to get DG John, Joan Scott, and many other dignitaries to attend a ceremony on short notice. The Board tabled a decision in January regarding the Albany Med/City Mission reading glasses project, and we tabled it again due to lack of information; we've been trying to reach someone who could confirm how many pairs of reading glasses they still had on hand.

The Board voted not to donate to the RPI Global Medical Brigade's request for a monetary donation to support their overseas trip to support their mission. While their mission is admirable, the Board felt that there wasn't enough time to gather more information about the group before their scheduled trip.

The Board voted to hold two short meetings to select a Melvin Jones Award recipient and a Robert J. Uplinger Award recipient in between the General and Board meetings on April 4, 2018. KL Carol will send out a broadcast e-mail notifying all members of the short meetings. The point of holding in-person meetings instead of e-mail selection is to ensure confidentiality in the selection process, since an e-mail may be sent in error to a potential awardee.

KL Carol announced the availability of two more NYS & Bermuda Lions Foundation raffle tickets, as PDG Dave Harris kindly purchased one. KL Carol committed to purchasing a ticket if someone would split the cost of the ticket with her. IPP Chris Horan expressed a desire to split the cost of another ticket with one or more members. Of course, if three tickets are sold, we will qualify to purchase an Uplinger award. KL Carol will send out an e-mail asking for members to consider sharing the cost of a ticket with another member.

Our thanks to KL Carol for taking these minutes in Lion Jerry's absence.
