Between July 1, 2017, and June 30, 2018, the Albany & Troy Lions Club:

- Collected **14,000** used eyeglasses;
- Provided eyeglasses for 9 children and 23 adults;
- Recycled **150** used hearing aids through the Hearing Conservation Society;
- Provided **2000** hearing-aid batteries to a school for the deaf;
- Provided hearing aids to two senior citizens;
- Contributed to a new playset for Brothers Park, a playground in Watervliet;
- Helped send two kids to diabetes camp;
- Recycled **152** used cell phones through NABA;
- Sponsored 4 blood drives that collected enough to potentially save 240 lives;
- Participated in NABA's Low-Vision Technology Fair;
- Participated in a Health Fair for Seniors at Albany Jewish Community Center;
- Sponsored a H.S. sophomore in the Hugh O'Brian Youth Leadership program;
- Provided holiday gifts for a family of 4 who share a home at Vanderheyden;
- Contributed toiletries and other personal-care items to YWCA's Adopt-A-Family program
- For NEWS10's Coats for Kids campaign, we picked up **642** coats at various dry-cleaners and delivered them to central distribution points in Albany and Rensselaer counties;
- Donated to Lions Eye Foundation, Capital Roots, Lions Eye Bank, CampAbilities Saratoga.
