fice, and Preem Cabey, who is director of Albany's Dept of Recreation. They were both quite eager to get involved. Lion Greg moved that we accept them for membership pending receipt of their applications and check. The motion was seconded and passed, and in short order, they completed the apps on-line from their phones, we had the checks and they were welcomed into the club. We'll do their formal induction ceremony at our September membership meeting.

Fund raising: We will again participate in Boscov's friends helping friends and send each member a number of coupons to sell. They will be ordered soon.

Eyeglass collections: 4000 pairs sent last month, bringing the total to 17,000 for LY18-19.

Lion Greg submitted the application for an LCI/Anthem project. We would use the \$1500 grant to purchase blueberry plants, which would be planted at Albany Victory Gardens. 
