Lion David A. Harris April 1, 1942—February 8, 2021

It is with the deepest sadness that we report the passing of PDG Dave Harris at the age of 79. Lion Dave joined the Granville Lions Club in October 1977 and transferred to the Troy Lions Club in April 1988 but remained an Associate of Granville. He was District Governor of District 20-Y2 in 2001-2002 and a permanent member of the board of directors of the Albany & Troy Lions Club ever since. He was a bronze Knight of the Blind, a recipient of the Robert J. Uplinger Distinguished Service Award, and a Progressive Melvin Jones Fellow.

His cheerfulness, devotion to Lionism and wise council will be sorely missed.

Report of the meetings held on Wednesday, February 3:

General meeting:

PDG John McDonald gave a brief presentation about the Brandel-Murphy Youth Foundation and then told us that we were approved for the \$2000 grant we had applied for. This will be used to fund Greg & Jodi's Pandemic Produce Pick-up for the month of February.

Lion Jerry presented to Lion Greg (*in absentia*) a Key Award from LCI for bringing in two new members.

Our guest speaker was District Childhood Cancer Chair Lion Diane Lange from the Ballston Spa LC. She thanked us again for the personal and club-sponsored gift cards that we



donated to the Melodies Center at Albany Med last September. The Melodies Center for Childhood Cancer and Blood Disorders is the only provider of care for children and teens with cancer and blood disorders in the 25 counties it serves. It treats more than 1,400 children and their families annually. Other closely affiliated foundations are Nick's Fight to be Healed, Logan Strong and, of course, Ronald McDonald House. Each has a slightly different emphasis but they can all use donations of gift cards for meals, groceries, toiletries and other necessities. Diane suggests that each club have a cancer chair to coordinate the club's efforts. She told us about a 5-year-old cancer patient named J.J. Amisano who loves to get mail. Board meetings:

Lion Ruth volunteered to call Ronald McDonald House to see whether they could use any of our leftover SaveAround books. She will also call Melodies Center to see whether they want any knit hats.

As reported in the last *Rare Meat*, the Albany Leo Club is now a reality! They will be meeting (on Zoom, for now) on the first Tuesday.

Also as reported in the last *Rare Meat*, the Hat Committee has rechristened itself Warm Woolen Wishes. They are looking for both knitters and donations of yarn. [See page 6]

Also as reported in the last *Rare Meat*, we came up with the \$1800 needed to pay the security deposit and first month’s rent for De, the fire victim who spoke to us last month. \$500 came from our treasury, \$1000 from individual Lions and \$300 from a friend of Lion Eva’s.

We still have NYS&BLF raffle tickets available. They are \$100 each with a top prize of \$15,000. Individuals can buy whole, half or quarter tickets, and for every three that we take, we can present an Uplinger award. We also have raffle tickets to send one Leo from each district to the 2021 USA/Canada Leo Leadership forum; these are \$5 each with a first prize of a Ring® video doorbell.

NABA is looking for drivers to take their visually impaired clients to get Covid vaccine shots, and for someone to make Plexiglas dividers for their manufacturing area.

There were no new applicants for either eyeglasses or hearing aids.

We received a check from Boscov’s for \$101.07 from their Friends Helping Friends fundraiser last October.

We have submitted an application for another \$15,000 Albany Community Block Grant. This is virtually the same as the one we completed a few months ago except that we’ll be distributing hand sanitizer only.


A new member






