Minutes of the live meetings held on April 6 at the Red Front

General membership meeting:

We had a number of visitors this evening for our first live meeting in quite a while: DG Michele O'Hare, VDG Ricky and 2VDG Priscilla Laurin, PDG Ed and Lion Liz Stano, and Queta Duran, Program Manager for Big Brothers Big Sisters of the Capital Region.

Queta spoke to us about the community-based mentoring provided by BB/BS. It's an opportunity for an adult volunteer (called Bigs) to meet with local youth (called Littles) for one-to-one outings and activities, twice a month for a few hours. They currently have 80 Littles, 54 of them boys, most between 6 and 14 years old. They can always use more Bigs because there are more Littles who need the mentoring. DG Michele inducted two new members: Andy Pitonyak and Bobby Beard, both sponsored by Greg Sheldon. (Andy had been inducted on Zoom back in January, but this time he got his new-member kit.)

She then spoke about a number of subjects, including:

Interested Lions should attend the training sessions on April 30 (in Rome) or May 1 (in Lake George) or either one on Zoom.

Think about starting a specialty club (i.e., motorcycle or diabetes). This will be explored further at the MD20 convention in Niagara Falls May 20-22.

New York State will be marching first in the parade at the International Convention in Montreal June 24-28.

In Montreal, we'll be voting on a dues increase of \$3 in '23-'24 and \$2 each of the following years.

The District Testimonial is on June 17 at Van Patten GC.

We voted to spend up to \$60 to send flowers to Lion Shawn, who is heading into rehab after open-heart surgery.

Club and Charitable Fund board meetings:

KL Eva is looking for service projects where we can join forces with other clubs in our zone. Also, she now has access to a space in downtown Albany (The Bridge, 52 James St) that has potential as a meeting space for us and our Leos.

Questions were raised about some of the expenses associated with the blueberry orchard. It was explained that the income and expenses didn't always match up on the treasurer's report because they overlapped the change in fiscal year. We do have receipts for all expenses. Also, some of the expenses were paid by Eden's Rose Foundation because we had voted to not lay out funds until we received various grant funds,
