There's an alley between Clinton Ave and First St that connects our old blueberry orchard to the Produce Pickup and other Albany Victory Gardens' properties. Andrew Brown from Van Alen Institute did a presentation on what was initially called the Lucid Project, the goal of which is to transform that alley into a usable public space that will serve the entire West Hill community. It's since be renamed the HIVE project.

Our participation will consist of service projects like working there on Earth Day (as we have done for the past two years), providing diabetes info, and other such "soft" community services. We will not have any monetary obligation, but anything we choose to contribute will certainly be welcome.

Those in attendance approved our participation, but since it will be a long-term project and fewer than half the board was present, info was distributed by email to solicit opinions and a vote.

Lions SEE needs you!



The mission of Lions SEE, Inc. (Screening Eyes Early) is to decrease child-hood blindness through early detection and treatment of the most common vision disorders that cause amblyopia, ensuring that all children of New York State will be able to SEE their future.



We, as a club, want to be involved in this program, but before we spend \$8000 on a screening camera, we want to be sure we have enough people to conduct the screenings. They will generally be at a kindergarten, pre-school, or day-care center and typically take 2-3 hours. Will you commit to doing 1 or 2 screenings per month? It's a worthwhile way to spend a morning or two. Text, email or call Jerry to accept or ask questions (jerrygordon@juno.com or 518–366-5299). If you're interested, read how to become certified below.

One of the (very few) Lions to volunteer is Dr. Allen Zieker. During his first 25 years as a Lion, he was too busy being an ophthalmologist to participate much, although we greatly appreciate his ongoing generosity. Now that he has retired, he's been coming to meetings and signed up to do some screenings. You should, too.

By the time we go through the grant process to pay for the screener and train everyone in its use, our first screening will probably not be until September.

How to Become a Certified Eye Screener

You don't have to do this all in one sitting. Spread it out over whatever time period fits your schedule and lifestyle. Here's how to become a certified eye screener:

Go to **LionsKidSightUSA.org**. At the top of the page, click on GET CERTIFIED. Scroll down a bit and click on the **Lions KidSight Training Manual**. You can read the 16-page manual on line, but I suggest you also print it. It's got info you'll want to refer to later (unless you've got an excellent memory!).

Then, just above the manual, click on **LION'S KIDSIGHT USA TRAINING VIDEOS HERE**. Watch the first three videos (about 45 minutes total). These will give you an overview of the KidSight program and an understanding of why we're doing it. The second video especially will provide the technical stuff you need to know.

When you're ready to take the screener exam, click on <u>Sign In here</u>, just below the training manual. Sign in using username = **newyork** and password = **KidUSA**. You'll also need your Lions member number, which is listed on the club roster or is available from Lion Jerry. At some point after taking the exam, you will receive a personalized **Certificate** via email. You are welcome to print additional copies, to show schools that you and your team are truly qualified.
