Report of the board meetings held on March 17 on line

Lion Ruth received a \$500 grant from Price Chopper to purchase Spanish books for our Little Free Libraries. We also got \$1250 from Stewarts. Jerry reported that thanks to a tardy donor, the seal campaign now stands at \$1785.

Ruth reports that we bought 396 chocolate bunnies from Lions Eye Institute. Eva took 100 at \$2.50 each splitting the list price. Lions Jerry & Maryanne bought 24 for Lansingburgh Boys & Girls Club. Total so far we have sold 356. We still have 40 available and will donate any that are not sold by Easter.

On March 13, Queen's Guardians of AL-Fitrah and the Albany Leos held a very successful event that fed about 100 homeless and folks battling substance abuse from Cap City Rescue Mission and the shelter on Sheridan Ave. They supplied them with personal-care and clothing items, including Bombas socks and underwear from the Interfaith Partnership. The Leos wore their new T-shirts.

There is a zone meeting at SUNYA on March 26. Let Jerry know if you'll be there and he will report attendance for the whole club before the 3/21 deadline. Jerry will rummage through our "souvenir" collection at Eva's office to

Zone Meeting and Social

Refresher in Lions geography: Multiple District 20, which comprises all of New York State and Bermuda, is divided into 11 districts (N, E-1, E-2, W, Y, O, R-1, R-2, K-1, K-2, S). We're in District W, which has Schoharie, Albany, and Rensselaer counties as its southern border, the MA and VT borders on the east, Canada on the north and St Lawrence, Herkimer and eastern Oneida counties on the west. District W is further subdivided into 5 Regions (L, I, O, N, S). Each Region has a Zone A and a Zone B, except ours (Region O), which has only one Zone. The 7 clubs in our region/zone are Albany & Troy, Bethlehem, Duane, Greater Ravena Area, SUNY UAlbany Campus, Town of Wright/Schoharie Valley, and Waterford. District leadership encourages Region and Zone chairs to have group meetings once or twice a year.

On March 26, the new SUNY UAlbany Campus Club hosted our first zone meeting in several years. There were around 30 Lions present, including 7 A&T Lions, with pizza, salad, cookies, cupcakes and soft drinks to quell our hunger. An assortment of PDGs spoke about clubs working together on joint projects, the importance of growing our membership, and leadership training for club officers. The highlight of the evening (for us) was DG Holly McConchie inducting our newest Lion, Paul "Batman" Collins-Hackett. They're in the photo with Lion Queen Ghaffar-Adjei, Paul's sponsor.

Spelling Bee

For many years, the Times Union sponsored the Spelling Bee in our area, but they recently decided to discontinue that practice. So the Spelling Bee approached Eden's Rose Foundation to be the Regional Sponsor, and ERF recommended the Albany and Troy Lions Club as the lead sponsor and co-sponsored the initiative, leveraging its expertise in program development and community engagement. Recognizing the need for broader engagement, ERF brought in additional partners: The RED (Read Each Day)

Bookshelf – a well-established literacy program with school partnerships, and Albany Housing Authority – connecting with families and children who could benefit most from this initiative.

Initially, Lion Mike Suske, an ERF employee, headed up this project, but his sudden departure left us with a problem. Just like in the comics, Batman came to the rescue! As Executive Director of the RED Bookshelf and a new Lion (see page3), Paul was well positioned for this project. He lined up CapRep as a venue for our first regional competition as a no-charge contribution to the community. Following up on Mike's efforts, 38 students and their families showed up on March 29. They came from as far afield as Amsterdam, Middleburgh, Cobleskill and Northville. Paul had 5 volunteer judges, pronouncers, and other support staff to keep the morning running smoothly.

Unfortunately, I didn't catch the winner's name, but she'll be off to Washington to compete in the national finals. We'll keep you posted.


