Our matching grant application for \$1250 to the Brandel-Murphy Youth Foundation does not require cabinet approval; we should send it in in ASAP.

Ruth reported that she had 3 requests for glasses, which were being filled by LensCrafters.

She also reported that we have stocked the Lions Free Library at the HIVE with over 500 books and 45 pairs of reading glasses in the year it's been there.

Queen is planning a major event to feed over 350 families at the Ida Yarborough apartments on Dec 20. This Sunday, 9/28, her Guardians and the Leos will be giving out meals and fresh produce across from the Rescue Mission.

In October, Batman will be showing the movie "The Right to Read" at the South End Children's café. In November, he'll be delivering turkeys. In December, they'll be doing Toys for Tots.

Report of the general meeting held on Wed, Oct 1, at Margarita City

Our guests were Niyra Pulinario; her daughter Angelica Bolta, who is a Leo; Youssry Salama; and James Losey, also a Leo. They all worked last Sunday on Queen's monthly feeding of the homeless and addicted of our community, as did Lions Ruth, Jodi and Greg. The event was in the old DMV parking lot across from Capital Mission in Albany. They fed over 100 people.

Queen had spent the previous night doing all the cooking for the event. Angelica volunteered to cook in the future, and Batman mentioned the availability of a commercial kitchen. James agreed to work on outreach and promotion.

By phone, Queen proposed a 3-way partnership of the Sheldons' Produce Pickup Project, her Guardians of Al-Fitrah, and the Lions/Leos. She requested the purchase of two 10x10 Lions- and Leo-branded pop-up tents, 4 folding tables, and 4 Lions tablecloths. We approved a motion to proceed with the purchase at a cost not to exceed \$2500. During the discussion, we recognized the need for a storage facility, not only for this equipment, but also for our existing (and growing) collection of bells, banners, historical documents like our charter and old photos, as well as miscellaneous paraphernalia. We tabled the storage discussion for a later time.

We discussed the Spelling Bee and its value, not only as a youth-related project but as a way to generate Lions PR within the broader community. Perhaps we can get other clubs in the 20W to spread participation in our Bee into their local schools, where they may already have contacts via vision screenings, the peace—poster contest or Lions Quest. There is interest in getting other Districts throughout the Multiple.

Report of the board meeting held on Wed, Oct 20, on Google. Meet

Margarita City does not want to house our paraphernalia that we need for meetings (banners, bells, flags, etc), so we discussed other possible locations. Among the suggestions: Metro 7 Diner in Latham, Westgate Diner in Albany, iron Gate Café in Albany, and a return to the Red Front in Troy. Ruth proposed holding our holiday party (Dec 3) at the Red Front. We also discussed having non-meal meetings at someplace like a meeting room in a library. Because of the limited attendance at this meeting, we came to no conclusion. We will hold our Nov 5 general meeting at Margarita City, where will discuss it further, hopefully with input from more members.





Lions SEE needs you!



The mission of Lions SEE, Inc. (Screening Eyes Early) is to reduce childhood blindness in New York State through early detection and treatment of common vision disorders that cause amblyopia, so every child can see their future clearly.



Vision screening for children is at the heart of the Lions' mission. Since NABA's screener retired, screenings are only being done part-time, which means there is a growing need for help. Our club wants to support this important program, but before investing \$8,000 in a screening camera, we need to be sure there are enough volunteers to conduct the screenings.

We are seeking three types of volunteers:

- Screeners: Must be certified; see the blue box below.
- Assistants: No certification needed. NOTE: Assistants don't have to be Lions. It can be anyone from the community who has a few hours once (or more) a month to do some very worthwhile volunteer work
- Administrators: One or two people to handle scheduling and paperwork.

Screenings typically take place in kindergartens, elementary schools, preschools, or daycare centers and generally last 1–3 hours. Would you consider volunteering for one or two screenings each month? It's a meaningful way to contribute a morning or two to a good cause. So far, one of the few Lions to step forward is Dr. Allen Zieker. During his first 25 years as a Lion, he focused on his ophthalmology practice and couldn't participate much, but we greatly appreciate his ongoing support. Now retired, Dr. Zieker regularly attends meetings and has signed up for screenings. You can make a difference too.

Becoming a Certified Eye Screener

You don't have to do this all in one sitting. Spread it out over whatever time period fits your schedule and lifestyle. Here's how to become a certified eye screener:

Go to LionsKidSightUSA.org. At the top of the page, click on GET CERTIFIED. Scroll down a bit and click on the Lions KidSight Training Manual. You can read the 16-page manual on line, but I suggest you also print it. It's got info you'll want to refer to later (unless you've got an excellent memory!).

Then, just above the manual, click on **LION'S KIDSIGHT USA TRAINING VIDEOS HERE**. Watch the first three videos (about 45 minutes total). These will give you an overview of the KidSight program and an understanding of why we're doing it. The second video especially will provide the technical stuff you need to know.

When you're ready to take the screener exam, click on <u>Sign In here</u>, just below the training manual. Sign in using username = **newyork** and password = **KidUSA**. You'll also need your Lions member number, which is listed on the club roster or is available from Lion Jerry. At some point after taking the exam, you will receive a personalized **Certificate** via email. You are welcome to print additional copies, to show schools that you and your team are truly qualified.

Earning Some Green by Going Green

You've all got your CLYNK recycling bags; I hope you're using them. If you need more for yourself, or for any friends or family members who are willing to help us out, contact Lion Jerry at 518-235-8232 or jerrygor-don@juno.com for more bags.

It's simple: Fill the bag with cans and bottles that are NYS-redeemable (water bottles, soda bottles & cans, beer bottles & cans). Bring the full bag to your nearest Hannaford, scan the label and drop the bag into the chute. All those nickels will be deposited right into our bank account. **This project earned us \$177 last year, but with greater participation, it could be a lot more.**


